What to Expect?

If you are hoping I would be making some bold prophecy about our future or your future in particular, I'm sorry to disappoint, but this will simply look at our

move to the basement.

You should have received information on the many details like what entrances and exits to use, what classroom your kids will be in, and where each music group will rehearse. Let me share a bit more from behind the scenes.

First, remember to make a joyful noise. Psalm 66:1, 95:1-2, 98:4-6, and 100:1, call us to make joyful sounds to God. It is not for us, but for God.

Meeting in the basement will test you. We are challenged to choose joy over grief, frustration, and anger; to focus on the grace and love of God in such a way that we can't help but sing praise with all our heart. I have regularly called the Worship Committee to reflect on preventing distractions. We certainly try, but ultimately you make a choice to rejoice or to linger in



annoyance. Come, rejoice in the Lord, again I say, rejoice! (Phil. 4:4)

With that said, let me help you celebrate by understanding some of the challenges we face and then how you can help us make it great. (It's not very theological from here on, but hopefully it's helpful.)

So, here are some challenges...

- 1. A large crowd absorbs sound. Each person is a sponge and we have no idea how much that will impact the sound until you are all in the room.
- 2. A low ceiling means you cannot project sound down at every row of people evenly.
- 3. A carpeted room and a tiled room respond very differently to sound. The tiled room will probably be more clear, but louder.
- 4. A new mixer with a hefty learning curve takes time to learn.

Here are some ways you can make this great!

Please celebrate what you hear based on content and effort of audio techs more than on volume. Our techs are learning a completely new system which they can control from a tablet or phone. More than one tech can be doing this at a time, and can move around the room while making improvements. This is amazing tech and the audio techs have good intentions, so celebrate what works.

Please rejoice in differing ears. I have been fascinated with and grieved over the struggles Pastor Ted has faced in no longer hearing pitches correctly. Some notes just don't sound like they should and clash with others. Our ears are all different. Some of you will love the full bass sound of this system and others won't. You may want more piano or more alto or less electric guitar, but please realize the sound tech is seeking to blend in a way that sounds as great as your car radio and that is impossible in a live setting.

Please sit further from the speakers if you don't like music loud. While we have some amazing new speakers that are designed to fill the room without blasting the people in the front, it will be louder closer to the speakers. Hearing Doug and I preach should be pretty good for all, but music will have a greater variation of volume. Choose your chair carefully.

Please put phones in airplane mode. We are using a WIFI network to control

the audio mix and volume in each space. Apparently, too many phones can cause interference and prevent audio techs from being able to make changes. The advantage is that we don't have a large table in the middle of the room with cables across the floor.

Finally, do show up early or bring a cushion. The padded seats are in the front and should fill up. The youth room has couches that are comfy but we are not sure how the live stream will work in there. Regardless, there is always value in fellowshipping with other believers and gathering for worship, even if the seats and sound aren't great.

We can be hurtful, or helpful. We can be encouraging, or discouraging. We can speak life, or we can speak death.

So if you're considering a new year's resolution, I would encourage you to consider making it your goal to speak with wisdom. I don't know that this is a measurable goal, and yes I want you to keep having fun, but join me in continuing to look for ways to glorify God, which in this case is with our words!

And if you do want a measurable goal for the upcoming year, make it your ambition to share the Gospel with as many people as possible, using your words.


