December is a season of joy... or at least it is supposed to be. Unfortunately, circumstances often hijack our hearts and minds. One of our youth recently found the family's deceased cat after it had been missing for weeks. Others are battling cancer. Many are weary of online schooling. More are sick of COVID conversations and political posturing. Our circumstances are ripe for a joyless Christmas.

You've probably noticed the lack of joy in others lately. Have you heard someone say, "Wow! Does she have an attitude!"? Have you ever said that about your child or maybe someone else's child? Or maybe you thought it of your spouse. It's not hard to spot a bad attitude in others even when they come in many shapes and sizes.

The Screamer will cry profusely, yelling "life's not fair."

The Pouter will force a frown and fold their

arms.

The Critic will repeatedly point out your shortcomings.

The Pessimist will ooze skepticism and suspicion.

The Attacker will release a barrage of past hurts.

The Retreater will stuff all emotion and disengage.

We can see the bad attitude come out with harsh words or not-so-subtle silence. We can see it in crossed arms, rolling eyes, and the wagging of a finger. Their bad attitude quickly crushes any joy in the room, and it's easy for us to blame them for our own bad attitude.

However, you have a choice. Your attitude is a choice. Paul repeatedly tells us to rejoice as in 1 Thessalonians 6:16 where he says, "Rejoice always". In 1 Peter 1:6, Peter commends the church for rejoicing in the midst of suffering.

In all this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while you may have had to suffer grief in all kinds of trials.

Mary, the mother of Jesus, made this choice amidst the difficulties of rejection and shame. Her infamous song is recorded in Luke 1:46-48...

And Mary said: "My soul glorifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

We have a choice to focus our attention on Jesus Christ or to let our circumstances hijack the joy of Christmas. So, I urge you to make time each day for Jesus. Here are some great options...

Read short sections of Luke 1 and 2 with your family each day,

Read Paul's letter to the Philippians,

Crank up some Christmas music,

Keep studying the Discipleship
Essentials workbook, and as you sense
God's joy in your heart, share it. Don't
keep it to yourself. Rejoice! And soon
people will be saying, "Wow! Does he/she
have a GREAT attitude!"

The Good News

mountains are the feet of those who bring
good news, who proclaim peace, who
bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation,
who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!"

We're coming to the time of year that we celebrate the birth of Christ coming into the world, which was God's plan to provide an opportunity for those who believe in Him to be saved from the consequences of sin.

The bad news is that sin separates us from God. The Greek word used most often in the New Testament for sin is *hamartánō*. The definition for this word reveals to us the true nature of sin.

hamartánō (from 1 /A "not" and 3313 /méros, "a part, share") — properly, having no share in; to sin, which always brings forfeiture — i.e. eternal loss due to missing God's mark... (hamartánō) is regularly used in ancient times of an archer missing the target.

So sin, as defined by the Word of God, by nature declares that we are not a part of, have no share in, have forfeited, have eternally lost, our relationship with God.

As if that's not bad enough, there's more bad news. Not only does sin separate humanity from God, but Romans 3:23 says that "all have sinned". What a hopeless state for humanity: sin separates us from God, and all have sinned, so we are all separated from God.

But, because man left to himself had no hope of being reunited with God; God had to come to earth Himself, in the form of a man, to redeem our hope of spending eternity with Him.

That's the Gospel! That's the Good News!

It's not only good news, there's never been better news in all of the history of humanity. That's why we take time each year to celebrate the birth of the one God sent to save us. When we understand the gravity of what eternal life without God would be like, we will have more gratitude than we know what to do with, and we will be compelled to tell others what God has done for us, and for them.

So as you take time this Christmas season to celebrate the birth of our Savior, remember that the greatest gift you could ever give anyone is to share the Good News with them that God sent His one and only Son to this earth to die as a payment for our sins, and because He's done this, we can spend eternity with our Creator. I hope you all have a Merry Christmas, knowing that we have hope in Christ for eternal life!

Golden Lifer's Update

As more and more evil in this world is being revealed one can't help but remember another time in history where the great wickedness of the world brought dire consequences. Gen 6:5-7 tells of God's evaluation of the situation. God's heart was deeply troubled/grieved. The perfect world, creatures and humans were being destroyed by grievous sin.

We may ask ourselves:

Has our world reached that point today?

2. Do we grieve along with God over the sin that is affecting all aspects of our lives, families, friends, nation and world?

In Luke 7 is the account of Jesus being anointed by a woman and the Pharisees criticism. Jesus later asked them who would love the most – those that were forgiven little or forgiven much. The rightful answer was that those who were forgiven most. Do we not grieve because we do not count our sins as grievous to a Holy God? Do we really think our sins are trivial compared to others?

3. Do we appreciate and realize how much we have been forgiven?

Unlike what Scripture teaches the New Age false religion teaches that there is no such thing as sin. All people need to do is accept that we are all "Gods". Sadly that thought has crept into the church and completely opposite of what I John 1:8 says, "If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us".

Evidence of this settling into the church is graphically spelled out in the annual updated Barna Survey. (For those unfamiliar with this survey it is conducted annually and compares answers that reveal if the one surveyed has a Biblical Worldview or Secular Worldview.) A

decline is evident and the pace seems to be picking up in recent years. Some striking percentages follow which will be confined to Main Line Protestants (MLP).

- 81% of MLP <u>reject</u> this statement – "The Bible is the primary source of moral guidance"
- 71% of MLP <u>reject</u> this statement "The bible is the word of God, is trustworthy and reliable"
- 63% of MLP <u>reject</u> this statement "People cannot earn a place in Heaven by being good or by doing good works"
- There are more discouraging stats but these are just a few to note.
- -Overall, MLP "had the most secular views with 60% expressing beliefs directly conflicting with Biblical teaching" that is reflected in the entire survey. Three overall concepts describing the Secular Worldviews of MLP include:
 - "Truth and morality are determined by the individual, not by God or the bible."
 - "Life has no inherent value on purpose but we can make the most of it by doing things that produce happiness or satisfaction."
 - "Traditional religious practices are neither considered to be central or essential to their Christian

Faith." Some things include Daily Bible

Reading (13%); Praying Every Day (49%); Confessing and Asking Forgiveness Everyday ((33%)

Not a pleasant picture. But the big question is what are we willing to do to change that for ourselves and the bigger picture of overall church stance? We cannot fully walk in the image of God that we were created to be unless we grieve with God in what He sees. Lord God, have Mercy and help us to be salt and light while there is still time and opportunity. Amen
